
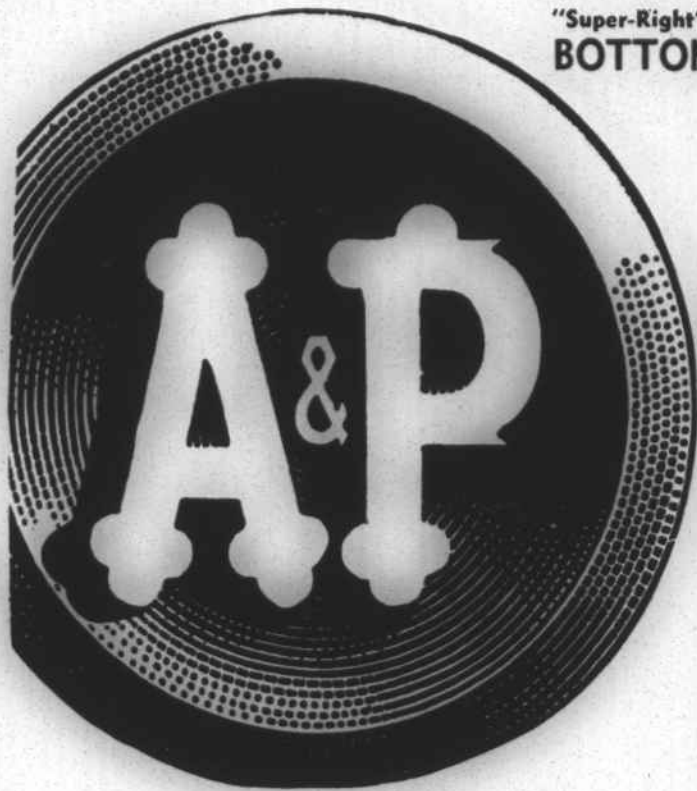

**Veterans Corner**  
The average monthly income -- after taxes -- of a veteran who obtained a GI home loan has increased from \$473 in 1956 to \$519 in 1964 a recent Veterans Administration survey reveals. The veterans home buyer's average monthly housing expenses, including loan payments, taxes, utilities, etc., has increased during the same period from \$107 to \$151, H. W. Johnson, Acting Manager of the Winston Salem VA Regional Office, said today. The average purchase price of a home bought under the GI program has increased from \$8,679 in 1950 to slightly more than \$16,000 during 1964. One of the main reasons for this jump in veterans are buying bigger and better homes, Johnson said. Slightly more than 71 per cent of the home purchased with GI loans in 1964 were bought with no down payment. The average loan term was 28 years and two months.
