

Robert V. Ozment is " a Doctor of Philosophy with the common touch," writes Dr. Charles L. Allen in his Intro-duction to this inspiration volume. No description could more adequately epitomize the highly effective ministry of this young man.

Widely read as a religious columnist for The Atlanta Constitution and some eighteen Georgia weeklies, he is constantly bringing hope and encouragement to thousands. He is the pastor of the St. James Methodist Church of Atlanta. This was the first of his three books.

With poignant perception and lucidity, the author deals with eight important areas: temptation, burdens, trouble, death, grief, prayer, hope and faith. These are areas which

are inextrically enmeshed in our daily lives. The author writes, "temptation is a traveling companion of every person who walks down the corridor of life. It has no regard for customs, race, or heritage. It cuddles up to the rich or the poor. Wherever you find human life, you may be sure temptation is near."
