Cherokee County Recorder's Court

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 28, 1966.

State-vs-Walter Hugh Kephart- The defendant pleads guilty to failing to surrender his operator's license after notice of revocation, and upon demand by representative of the North Carolina Motor Vehicle Department. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the common jail of Cherokee County for a period of three months and assigned to do work under the supervision of the State Prison Department, and pay a fine of \$25.00 and the cost of the action. The prison sentence is suspended with the consent of the defendant given in open court for a period of two years on the following conditions: (1) That the defendant pay the sum of \$10.00 on the fine and cost at this time, (2) That he pay the balance of the fine and cost in payments of \$25.00 each. The first \$25.00 payment to be due and payable on March 15, 1966 with the balance due on April 15, 1966, (3) That the defendant be of good behavior and not violate any of the laws of the states or federal government.

State-vs-Eugene Tweed- The defendant pleads guilty to operating a motor vehicle without a valid operator's license and with an improper registration. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State-vs-Broadus James Carringer- The defendant is called and failed. Let issue for his arrest. Bond is set in the amount of \$400.00 c.p.i.s.

State-vs-Jerry Lynn Moss- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 70 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State -vs- Hoyt Edward Graves- The defendant pleads guilty to operating a motor vehicle without complying with the financial Responsibility Act, and to improper registration. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the common jail of Cherokee County for a period of three months and assigned to do work under the supervision of the State Prison Department, and pay a fine of \$25.00 and the cost. The prison sentence is suspended with the consent of the defendant given in open court for a period of one year on the following conditions: (1) That the defendant pay the sum of \$15.00 at this time and that he pay the balance of the fine and cost in two equal payments. The first half of the balance to be paid on or before April 1, 1966, and the balance on or before May 1, 1966.

State-vs-Claude Hershell Hurt- Continued for the defendant until March 21, 1966.

State-vs-David James Burrell- The defendant pleads guilty to reckless driving, and speeding at the rate of 70 mph in a 55 mph zone, but not guilty to driving an automobile upon the public highways while under the influence of intoxicating liquors. After hearing the evidence the court finds the defendant guilty as charged. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the com-

mon jail of Cherokee County for a period of four months and assigned to do work under the supervision of the State Prison Department and pay a fine of \$100.00 and the cost of the action. The prison sentence is suspended with the consent of the defendant given in open court for a period of twelve months on the following conditions: (1) That the defendant pay the sum of \$50.00 on the fine and cost at this time, (2) That he pay the balance of the fine and cost on or before March 15, 1966, (3) That the defendant be of good behavior and not violate any of the laws of the United States. The defendant will turn his drivers license over to the Clerk of the Superior Court to be forwarded to the Department of Motor Vehicles and handled as required by law.

State -vs- Hubert Ben Thomas- The defendant pleads not guilty to reckless driving. After hearing the evidence the court finds the defendant guilty as charged. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the common jail of Cherokee County for a period of 90 days and assigned to do work under the supervision of the State Prison Department.

State -vs- Frederick William Roosa- The defendant pleads guilty to operating a motor vehicle upon the public highways of North Carolina without a valid North Carolina Operator's license, and to improper registration. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay a fine of \$25.00 and the cost.

State-vs-Julie Elizabeth Roberts- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 70 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State -vs- Harlan David Smith- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 65 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State-vs-Jerry L. Stiles- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 65 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State-vs-Bill Erwin Hampton- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 65 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State-vs-Thomas Blaine Canup- The defendant pleads guilty to operating a motor vehicle without a valid operator's license. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State -vs- Harry Whitlow Heidelberg- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 70 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost. The sci fa previously issued in this cause is stricken.

State -vs- Marvin James Rose- The defendant pleads guilty to operating a motor vehicle without a valid operator's license, and to an improper muffler. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay a fine of \$25.00 and the cost.

State -vs- Bill White- The defendant pleads not guilty to an assault upon one Larry Allen. After hearing the evidence the court finds the defendant guilty as charged.

It is the defendant pay a fine of \$100.00 and the cost of the action.

State-vs-Clifton Thomas- The defendant pleads not guilty to aiding and abetting in reckless driving, but guilty to resisting arrest. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant be confined in the common jail of Cherokee County for a period of six months and assigned to do work under the supervision of the State Prison Department, and pay a fine of \$50.00 and the cost of the action. The prison sentence is suspended with the consent of the defendant given in open court for a period of three years on the following conditions: The conditions will be the standard probation judgment with the one additional condition, that he pay the sum of \$40.00 at this time, and that he pay the balance of the fine and cost on or before two months from date.

State-vs-Billy Joe Collins- The defendant pleads guilty to speeding 70 mph in a 55 mph zone. It is the judgment of the court that the defendant pay the cost.

State -vs- Charles Leon Mingus- The defendant is called and failed. Judgment nisi fa and capias.

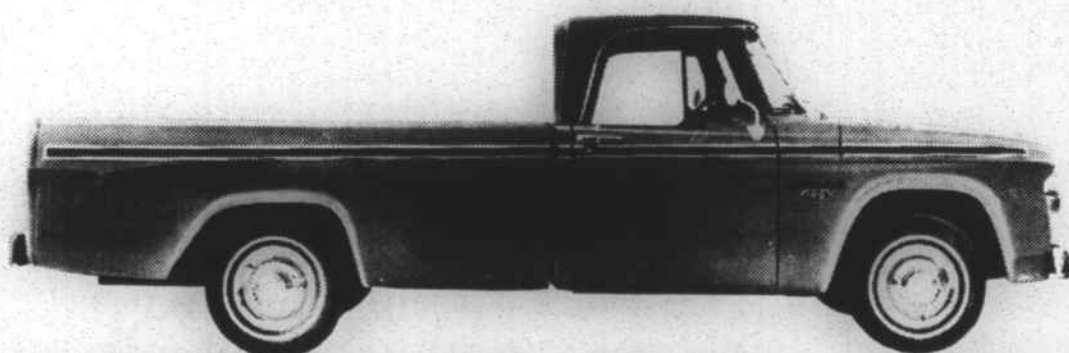
Miss Terri Day represented the Andrews Club in the scholarship competition.
