

Girl Scout Roundaree To Be Held April 22-24

Several hundred Girl Scout Cadettes and Seniors are expected to attend the third Girl Scout Roundaree which will be held April 22-24 at Apple Tree Group Camp in Nantahala National Forest, between Franklin and Andrews.

The encampment is sponsored this year by the Senior Planning Board of Pisgah Council which has set up committees to plan every phase of the event. The site is that of the All-States Encampment of Girl Scouts of the United States of America held last year and again in 1966 and 1967.

Purpose of the Roundaree program is to develop a better understanding and appreciation of the history and customs of the Cherokee. The Program Committee is working with Mrs. Mary Chiltonsky of Cherokee to plan a visit to the camp Saturday by Indians. They will conduct workshops in Indian crafts, live woodcarving, basketry, ceramics and beading. Girls may also learn legends, songs, bits of the Cherokee language and dances, from the guests.
