Robert Leatherwood, III, attorney of Bryson City, is seeking the Democratic Nomination in the coming May Primary for one of the District Judgeships newly created for the 30th Judicial District.

Mr. Leatherwood is a former Legislator from Swain County. While serving in the House of Representatives he became well known for his outstanding interest in Western North Carolina and its people.

He was a member of the Public Utilities Committee and participated in revising and rewriting the North Carolina Public Utilities Laws.

He served as Chairman on the Institutions for the Blind, and received a citation for his progressive active support on their behalf.

Mr. Leatherwood is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Leatherwood of Bryson City.

The Leatherwoods are members of the Haywood and Cherokee Counties Leatherwood family, the family having moved to Buncombe County (now Haywood County) in 1800, locating on Jonathan's Creek just below present Dellwood.

After graduating from Swain County High School, Mr. Leatherwood entered the military service. As a member of the famed 82nd Airborne Division he served as a Paratrooper in Italy and later participated in the invasion of France.

After being wounded in action in France, he entered Wake Forest College, graduating in 1949, with a B. S. degree in Political Science. While doing his under graduate study he was a member of the Veterans Club, Pre-Law Society, Young Democratic Club and member of the Pi Kappa Alpha Social Fraternity.

After receiving his degree from Wake Forest College he entered Wake Forest School of Law receiving his L. L. D. degree in Law in 1951. He was admitted to the Bar and has been actively engaged in the practice of Law in Swain County in both State and Federal Courts since 1952.

Since returning to Swain County he has been an active civic and political leader. He has served as President of the Swain County Chamber of Commerce and is now serving his 6th term as Secretary of the Swain County Democratic Executive Committee. He has also been President and Vice President of the 30th Judicial District Bar and is a member of the Local and N. C. State Bar. He is now County Attorney of Swain. He is also a member of the Executive Committee of the Swain County Hospital which is undertaking a campaign to expand its facilities.

Mr. Leatherwood is married to the former Meredith Shook. They have two children, Robert Leatherwood, IV, and Nelly Madge Leatherwood.

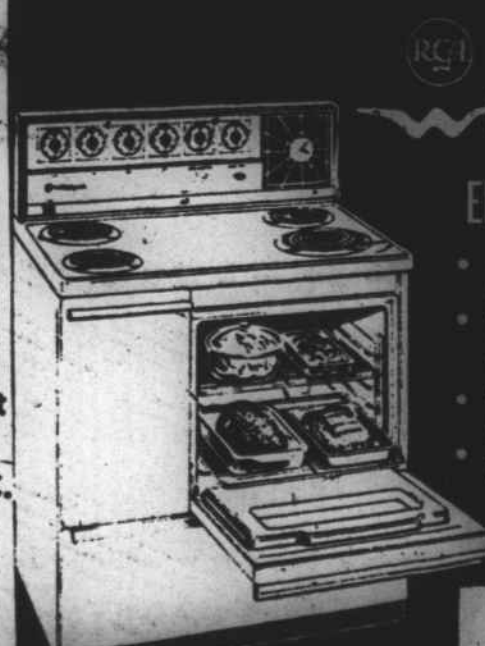
