ITEM: When buying area or accent rugs, check the under-neath as well as the top of the rug. These small size floor coverings need firm anchoring. If the rug is washable, the backing should also be wash-able. A backing of supple, fine-celled urethane (plastic foam) is both safe and washable. is both safe and washable.

ITEM: Pine tip blight is a fungus disease that disfigures Scotch, red, Austrian and mugho pine and balsam fir. The casual organism grows through the needles and destroys twig tissues. By mid-summer tips of branches begin dying. Tree experts recommend spraying of pine buds as they

open, applying a copper fungi-cide. If spring is wet, a second application 10 days later and a third at equal interval may

be necessary. Spray when the new candles of growth are pale . . . ITEM: You can walk at least four miles and spend 25 hours of your time during one year in making just one bed by the common dash-a-around method. Why not learn to make one side completely, then the other side? You'll find you can cut your time and effort

can cut your time and effort used in bedmaking. **ITEM:** Scrub the undersides of scatter rugs occasionally with heavy suds to remove dust and wax. Only clean backing can grip the floor securely.


