

On Sunday morning, June 19, the group will assemble at 10:00 a.m. at the Rock Gym. Memorial Services will be held at 1:30 that afternoon at


Grape Creek Baptist Church. This gathering will be in memory of Farmer relatives buried at Grape Creek, Hanging Dog, and other cemet-


