Veterans Corner

Q. My son is being discharged from service next month and I want to be sure he keeps his veterans insurance. I regret that I dropped mine after World War II. What does he have to do?

A. Servicemen are now covered up to \$10,000 while on active duty and for 120 days thereafter by Servicemen's Group Life Insurance. Unlike after World War II, however, they cannot keep this insurance as veterans insurance. Instead, within 120 days after being separated from service they must convert their SGLI policies to policies with a commercial company. Nearly 600 companies have been approved by the VA to offer converted.

If your son has a service-connected disability, he may also be eligible for \$10,000 special insurance through the VA that can be in addition to or in the place of his converted SGLI coverage.

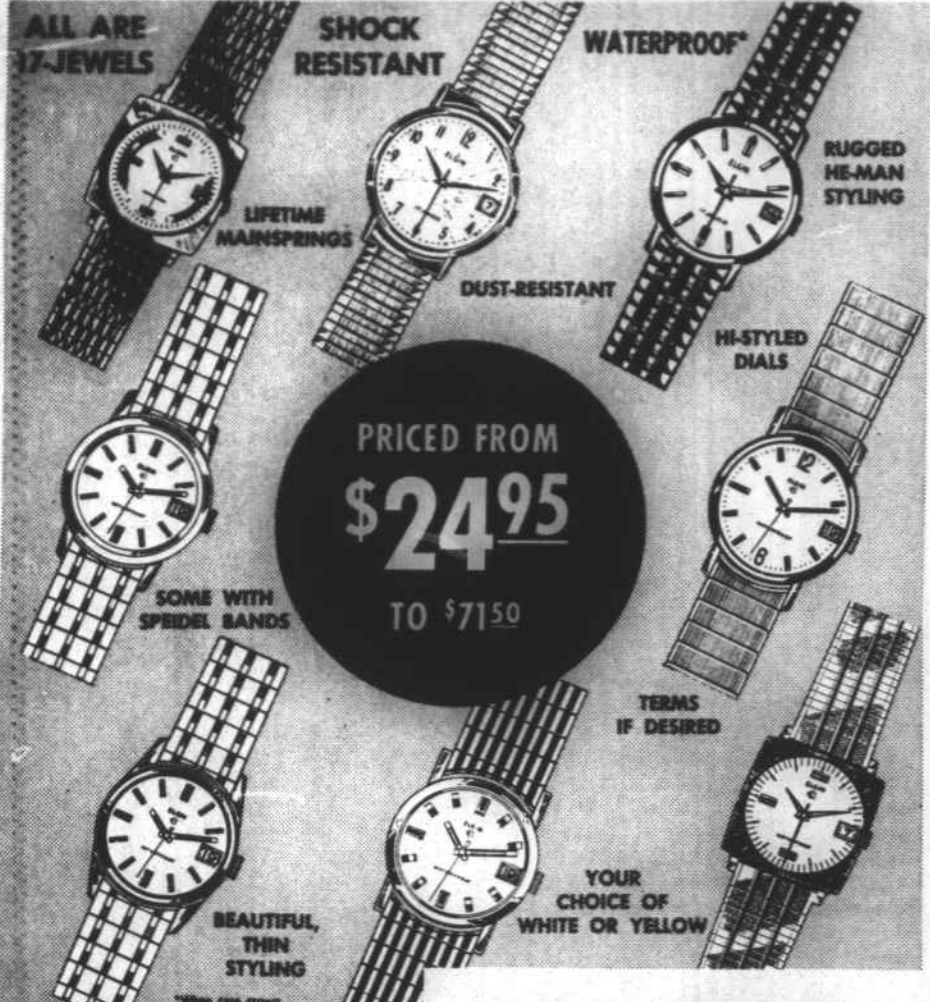
Q. I am a veteran attending college under the G.I. Bill and plan to be married in the near future. Can I claim my wife as a dependent for an increased educational allowance from the Veterans Administration even though she will be working? What documents do I have to submit to VA?

A. Yes, you may claim your wife as a dependent regardless of whether she is working. As a full-time student your VA educational assistance allowance under the G.I. Bill will be increased from \$130 to \$155 a month.

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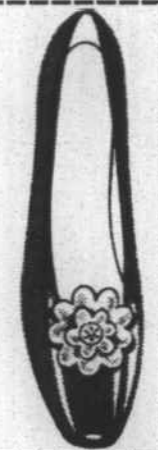
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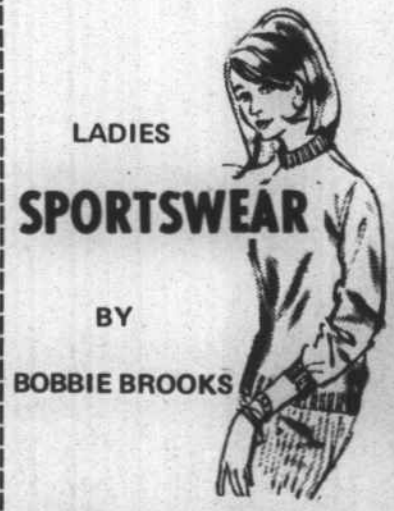
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
