### IRS NEWS

GREENSBORO, N.C.—Divorced or separated parents planning to claim a child as a dependent on Federal income tax returns can avoid possible tax controversy by carefully reading the guidelines.

J. E. Wall, District Director of Internal Revenue for North Carolina, said the guidelines should especially be referred to in cases where divorced or separated parents claim the same child as a dependent.

Generally, the parent with custody of the child for the greater part of the year is entitled to the dependency deduction. There are exemptions to this rule, depending on the terms of the decree and the amount contributed to the child's support by the parent who does not have custody.

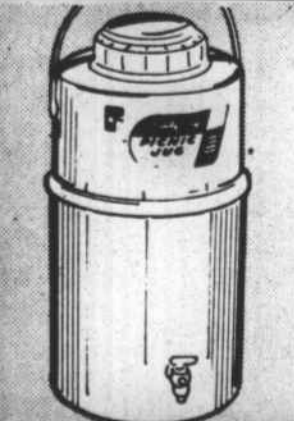

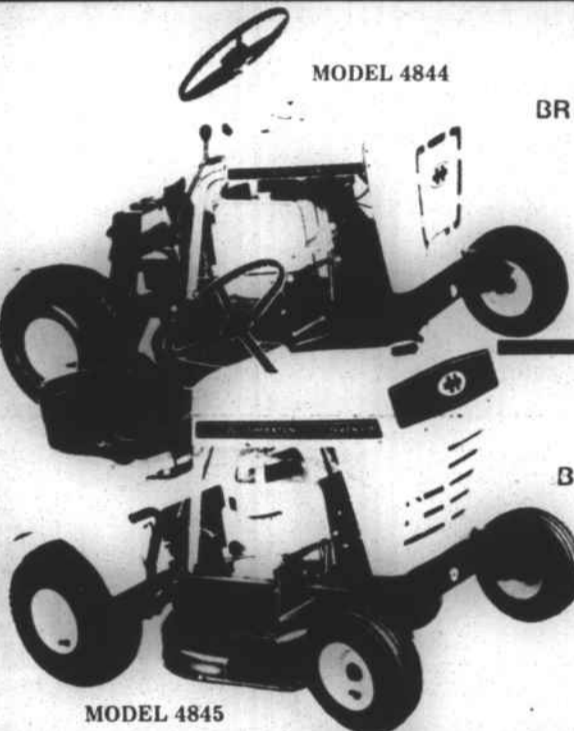
