Man Shot

An Andrews man died early Wednesday enroute to the hospital and another was placed in he county jail at Murphy under a murder charge, according to Andrews Chief of Police, Milton Mashburn.

According to Mashburn, "Tabby" Moore was shot in the left side of the chest and stomach with a 12-gauge shotgun by Floyd Gray, also of Andrews. Moore, an employee of Boring Chevrolet, was at work;

A total of 3,095 miles of road were patrolled in Cherokee and Clay Counties during the week ending August


