The Murphy Chapter of Future Farmers of America (FFA) was presented an award on June 9 in ceremonies held at the William Neal Reynolds Coliseum on the campus of North Carolina State University at Raleigh.

An plaque designating the chapter as the area winner in the "Building Our American Communities," (BOAC) Program was presented to Chapter President Stanly Barnett and Chapter Advisor, W.L. Roberts, by Landis Phillips, State FFA President, and James T. Johnson, State Director of the Farmers Home Administration, which is a sponsor of the BOAC Program.

The Murphy FFA Chapter is one of seven FFA chapters in the state receiving the award. The awards ceremonies were part of activities held in connection with the State FFA convention.

The "Build Our American Communities" (BOAC) Program was inaugurated last fall.

The purpose of the "Build Our American Community" Program is to encourage and assist tomorrow's leaders to become more active in the development of their communities.

The new program combines classroom study of community problems with practical action projects. The basis for the Building Our American Communities Program is a teacher's guide prepared by the Farmers Home Administration for use in the Vocational Agriculture classroom. FFA members study the need for community development, a study of citizens wants and needs, resources available to the community, the need for pollution control and explanation of constructive activities to be carried out in the community.

Projects adapted by FFA chapters include community resource surveys, agricultural, industrial and business job surveys and development, environment, drainage and control of water, air and solid waste, community beautification and maintenance, recreational purposes and facilities, community safety and health care, and community housing surveys and development.

The major project for the Murphy FFA Chapter was the Four Star Maintenance and Town and Country Beautification Program. The 50 member chapter carried out a clean-up and beautification campaign with the local Garden Club and participated with the Retired War Veterans in maintaining two war memorials in addition to other projects.

Chairman of the Committee for Community Development activities is Danny Henson.

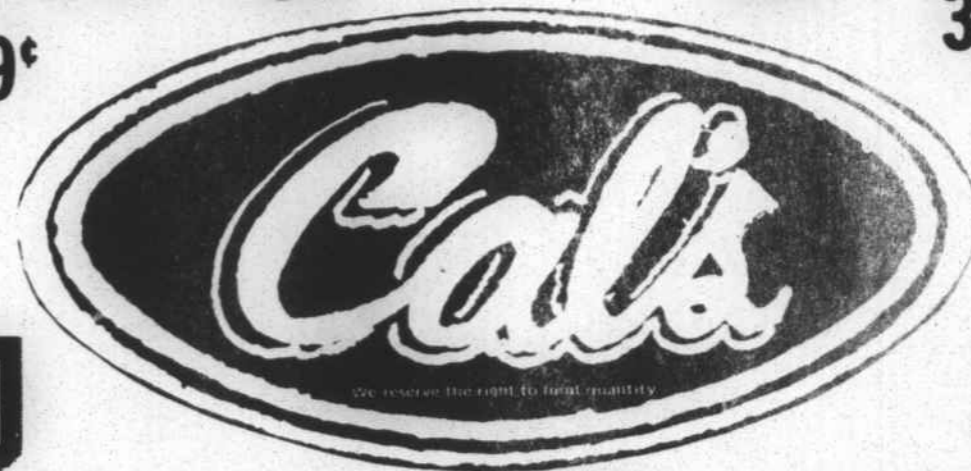

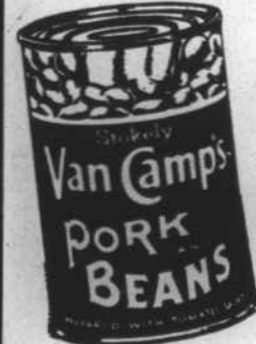
