"In conclusion I desire to say that in these charges I have used no names of third parties, because I do not desire to injure those who are my friends. while, at the same time, they have acted as messengers for you; but if you deny that you suggested the outrageous alternative published in this leter, I as sure you that I have full and ample proof to substantiate my statement. "ROBERT HANCOCK."

This letter has caused great indignation here against the Governor, and quite a revolution of feeling in Hancock's favor.

There can be no doubt as to the truth of the charges Mr. Hancock makes against the Governor. He has it, he says, in black and white. The Journal to-morrow morning will say editorially:
