WILSON, BRYAN, M'ADOO AND REDFIELD ON LIST

They Are to Address the United States Chamber of Commerce in February.

Washington, Jan. 19.—President Wilson and Secretaries Bryan, McAdoo and Redfield will be among the speakers before the convention of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States to be held here February 7 to 9.

Secretary Bryan, according to plans announced tonight, will speak on American investments abroad. Secretary Redfield will discuss foreign trade conditions and the effect upon them of the European war.

Concentrates His Attention on Campaign For Master of Siam. The retention of the Federal Reserve Act to American trade expansion will be discussed by Samuel M. Grabert, vice president of the National City Bank, New York, who will be followed by Charles S. Hamlin, governor of the Reserve Board.
