

WATTS HOSPITAL

One Jones County youngster came home from Watts Hospital in Durham last week, and another took its place. The homecoming was that of 16-month-old Denford Eubanks, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Eubanks of Pollocksville. The hospitalization was that of three-week-old Hazel Jean Hill, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Hill of Trenton.

Young Denford had recuperated sufficiently from an attack of infantile paralysis to return home, after favorable response to some two weeks of treatment by specialists at the Durham hospital. His was the first case of poliomyelitis to be found in Jones County this year. His mother has been instructed in the massaging of the youngster's affected left leg.

Little Hazel Jean's trouble was being born too soon. She is a premature baby, weighing only three pounds six ounces at birth. Since that time she has gained two ounces. Her first special care came from Dr. Thomas Vasey in Trenton. The attending physician took her into his home for special attention until arrangements were completed by the Jones County Health Department to move her to Watts.

The little girl will need at least one month's care, according to the health department, and if financial aid is needed it will be available from the State Board of Health and the Children's Bureau of the federal government. Such aid for premature babies has recently been set up by the two agencies, providing up to \$13 a day in designated centers, of which Watts Hospital is one.
