

BE SURE TO GET SOCIAL SECURITY CARD FOR HOLIDAYS

High School students who intend to work during the holiday season should be sure they have a social security account number card, says Marshall H. Barney, manager of the Rocky Mount Social Security Office.

Even though the employment is only temporary, the wages are credited to the Old-Age and Survivors Insurance account of the worker. Since each account is set up under the worker's name and account number a social security card is absolutely necessary in order to be sure the wages are credited to the proper account.

All of the responsibility for proper crediting does not fall on the employee, however, warns Barney. The employer is re-

sponsible for reporting the worker's wages correctly and he should be employed without either the social security card or a temporary receipt showing a card has been applied for, or an application for a social security card should be completed at once.

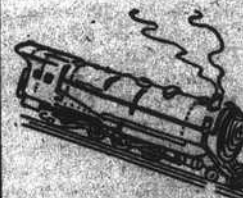

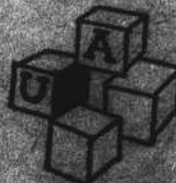

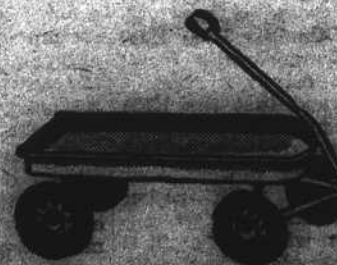
