Oklahoma and Texas castor bean growers used mechanical strippers to harvest a large part of their crop this year for the first time.

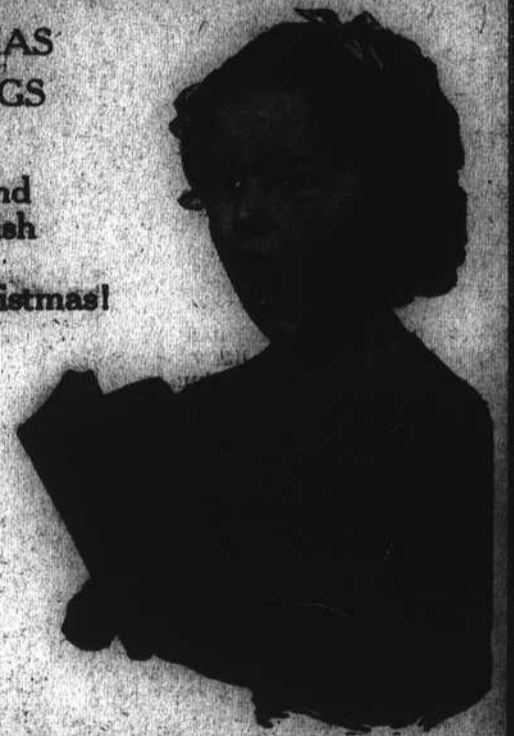
Corn hybrids are most productive when planted to close stands and heavily fertilized with nitrogen, phosphoric oxide and potash.
