The heavy cruiser USS Los Angeles has returned to the Korean east coast bombardment line from a rest period at Yokosuka, Japan. Aboard her is Robert V. Dawson, interior communications electrician third class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. V. Dawson of Route 3, Kinston. Since beginning her second tour of combat duty in the Far East last October, the "glamour girl of the Pacific Fleet" has fired over 8,000 rounds of high explosive and incendiary shells into Communist position. She has served as anti-aircraft support ship for fast carrier Task Force 77.
