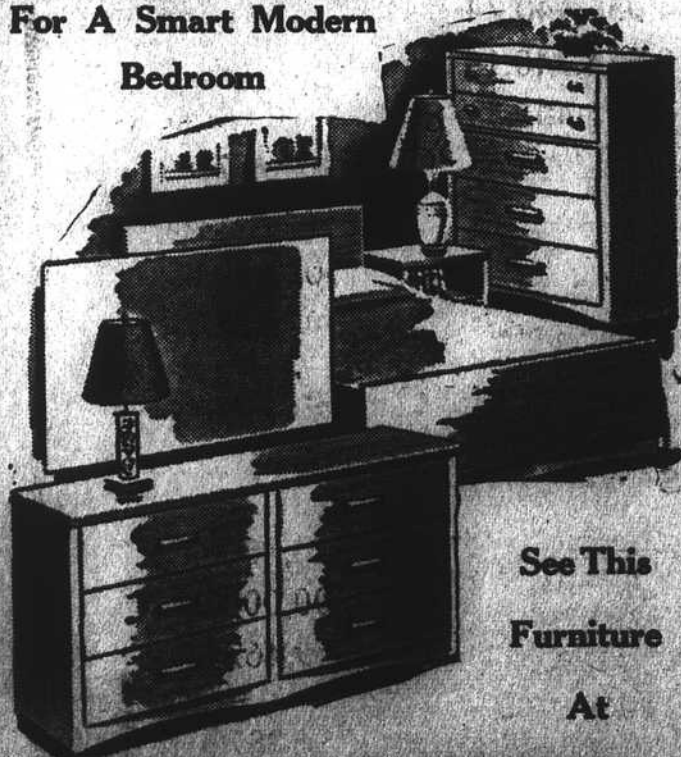

The Lenoir County Livestock Association in cooperation with the North Carolina Hereford Association and the Kinston Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring a sale of sixty-seven pure-bred Hereford cattle in Kinston on October 29.

The show and sale will be held in the Co-operative Warehouse in Kinston, with the show to begin at 9 a. m. and the sale at 1 p. m. Friday, October 29.

**Disability 'Freeze' Will  
Increase Social Security  
Benefits in Many Cases**

A recent amendment to the Social Security Law may protect your future benefit amount if you are seriously disabled now or in the future, Marshall Barney, Manager of the Rocky Mount Social Security Office, says, if you are already receiving social security retirement benefits, you may be able to have your benefit refigured if your disability kept you out of work before you were 65.

To have your years of no earnings due to a disability excluded from the figuring or refiguring of your benefit, Barney added, you must have been in work covered by the social security program for at least five years. These five years must have been in the ten years right before the disability began. And one and a half of the five years must have been during the three years just before the disability began.

The disability must have lasted at least six months in order to be medically determinable. It must be a physical or mental illness which caused unemployment.

No application for a disability freeze may be filed before January of 1955, Barney stated. He warned that this program does not provide for cash benefits for disability, but for a freeze of the benefit level only.
