Spaulding says that one of his farmers was about to lose confidence in his crop of hybrid corn until it rained recently.



QUESTION: How fast should water be applied when irrigating?

ANSWER: Water should never be applied faster than the soil can absorb it. The infiltration rate varies with the type of soil.

QUESTION: At what age should cattle be dehorned?

ANSWER: It is important to dehorn calves when they are small — from one week to two months old.

QUESTION: Why the sudden preference for light-plumaged birds?

ANSWER: Growers like them because they market readily, processors because they are easier to dress, and consumers because they look clean and appetizing.

ACP Cites Pasture Improvements Need

"A penny saved, is a penny earned." That old adage has a special meaning at this time for Tar Heel farmers in view of summer drought conditions during the past three years, Clyde R. Greene, Chairman of the State Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee, believes.

He says, "The big problem this year is to produce all the feed we can, and at the same time, make our reserves go as far as they will by making good use of our pasture and hay land." This does not mean cutting down on livestock production through reduced feeding, but it does mean checking waste and using available feed efficiently, he added.

Greene points out that through Spaulding says that he convinced the man to try hybrid seed corn this year at a community meeting. Luckily for Spaulding rain took him off the hook with the farmer who is now well-pleased with his corn.

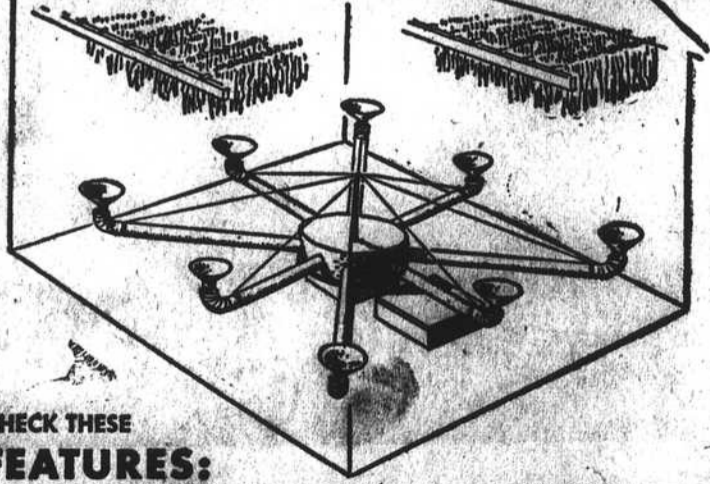
