 place in population, was a mighty long way behind Raleigh in sales tax collection, coming in sixth in that line-up with collections of only \$155,400.76.

Asheville, which is Tar Heel's sixth city in size, ranked fifth in the matter of sales tax collections, with \$173,854.91.

Wilmington was seventh in both categories with \$180,127.05 reported for August sales tax collections.

High Point, the eight ranking city in size, came in ninth with sales tax at \$100,993.22 and Fayetteville which ranked just behind High Point in population, beat the Guilford County furniture center in the sales tax listings with \$139,869.50 reported for August sales tax payments.

The poorest relative showing of any city in this monthly sales tax collection report comes from Kannapolis, the state and nation's largest un-incorporated city, which is the 10th largest urban center in North Carolina and yet it ranked 19th in sales tax collections. Its reported collections were just \$50,310.55.

As mentioned above, Rocky Mount, the state's 11th city in population, placed 13th in sales tax collections with \$68,004.91.

Burlington, the 12th largest town, ranked 11th in sales tax payments with \$75,929.98.

Gastonia, the 13th city in people, was 10th in sales tax, with \$76,109.77.

Wilson, Tar Heel's 14th city, was 17th in the tax race at \$55,442.47.

Goldensboro ranked just behind Wilson in population as the state's 15th city and very slightly edged Wilson for the No. 16 spot in sales tax payments with \$55,097.25.

Salisbury is the 16th city in population and the 14th in sales tax reports, with an August collection of \$63,131.68.

Kinston came next in the population and as the 17th city in size and with \$63,131.68 placed 15th in the tax parade. Greenville is the 18th city in population and the 20th in sales tax payments with an August collection of just \$42,227.29.

New Bern came after Greenville in population as the state's 19th city in that category and with collections of \$50,310.55 in August it ranked 16th in sales

tax payments to the state. Like surprising among the state's 20 largest cities was Hickory, which is the 20th city in population rank and yet ranked 12th in sales tax payments with August collections of \$73,776.95.

If those "oldtimers" who had doubts about the ultimate development of these areas had ever given much study to the drainage problem of these two areas, they should have recognized that it was not too difficult a nut to crack, since the area roughly embraced in the two subdivisions is some of the highest land around Kinston. It would have been recognized that draining a hilltop was not such a terrific problem.

But it was a problem of considerable proportion. The area which roughly embraces the golf course of the Kinston Country Club was high enough but it was saucer like, so larger ditches, storm sewers and new streets had to come before home sites could be made accessible.

This has now been done, however, and the two areas which ultimately will join are filling up with some of the finest, most beautiful homes to be found in this vicinity.
