Murphy's battalion took part in a series of day and night firing missions with 105 mm. howitzers. It was tested on accuracy, security and communications.

Murphy is a truck driver in Battery A of the 10th Infantry Division's 35th Field Artillery Battalion.

He entered the Army in January 1955 and arrived in Europe in July of that year.

He received basic training at Fort Riley, Kan. Murphy attended North Carolina Agriculture and Technical College.
