Pvt. Paul Spivey Now In Southern Germany

As part of the U. S. Seventh Army, the 9th Division conducts rigorous training exercises, including realistic maneuvers and field problems.

Question: How can I prevent detaching desirable crops when I spray weeds with 2,4-D?

Answer: By following these practices, says Bill Wattmoreland, Extension Weed control specialist:

- (1) use an amine salt of 2,4-D;
- (2) use equipment with weed spraying nozzles; pressures of more than 30 pounds can't be controlled;
- (3) use a boom sprayer for most crops;
- (4) do not use 2,4-D contaminated sprayers for other chemicals; and
- (5) use caution in applying to fields where drainage water might wash into fields of susceptible plants.

Question: How much money can I expect from a colony of bees?

Answer: Good colonies, kept from swarming, will store at least two supers (60 pounds) in a fair year, according to W. A. Stephen, extension beekeeper.

Question: What is a fair net return for cotton?

Answer: Demonstration farms, in 1954, employ all of the recommended practices and netted \$95 an acre on the average.

Walton Better Move

For the third time in recent years the Wynne Park's Home of Walton Daughety has been rammed and considerably damaged by rampaging automobiles. Early Sunday morning a carload of lost Camp Lejeune Marines piled into the Daughety home after failing to stop when coming out of the Trenton Highway which intersects with the Kinston-New Bern road in front of the Daughety home. One of the six Marines suffered two broken legs, a broken jaw and a large number of missing teeth. Another suffered one broken leg and the other four escaped with minor lacerations. After emergency treatment at Parrott Memorial Hospital they were all transferred to Camp Lejeune.

Protect by a complete set of doors by painting or staining. Use of water finishes.

Outdoor furniture will require different treatment from indoor furniture. Furniture should be cleaned with new linoleum, using the place to be cleaned as a pattern for the new one. Furniture should be washed beyond repair can be completely rebuilt from new lumber with the disassembled pieces serving as patterns for the new ones. Several applications of an old favorite glue can be made easily in this manner.

Old furniture to be refinished should first be cleaned with water and detergent. Let dry thoroughly. Brush worn or chipped spots with a wire brush, sand smooth and feather the edges. Fill cracks and holes with wood putty and sand smooth when dry. Touch up all such spots with enamel undercoat.

Clean every surface with a good quality wood preservative. Use with one coat of a paint or varnish. Do not be lulled by the name of the product.

Send the entire article and apply an enamel undercoat.

WOODEN FURNITURE

Use enamel undercoat, crack filler, then exterior enamel.

Flow on the enamel and avoid letting it collect on the edges. Remove all dust before applying any portion of the finish. Spar varnish is frequently all that is needed to refinish rattan furniture. If enamel is preferred, apply it as on wood. Spraying is preferable on wicker furniture. Prevent accumulations of the finish at the wicker intersections.
