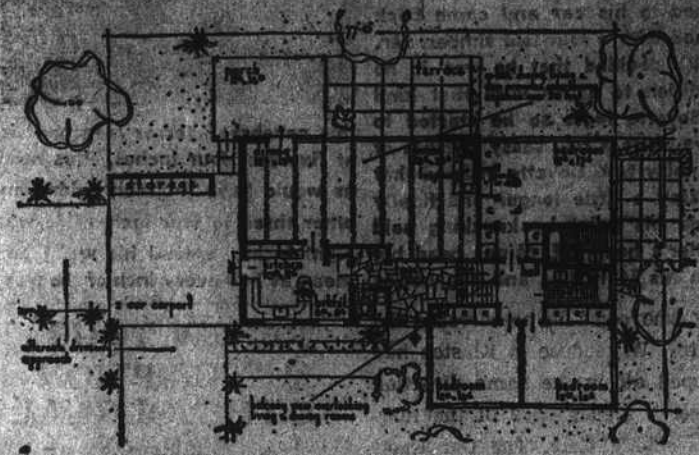


King-Size Split-Level From New Homes Guide

Beat His Wife, Raped His Friend, Indictments Assert; Grocery Clerk Has Fled Kinston Area

Kenneth Earl Grant, a grocery store clerk, had two warrants signed against him Monday night. The first by his wife charging that he had beaten her and torn up their apartment 22B Simon Bright Homes.

Shortly afterwards Mildred Lane a resident of the Mayflower Trailer, Park just North of Kinston, swore in a warrant that Grant had raped her. The alleged attack took place at her trailer home, Miss Lane swore.

Grant reportedly had left North Carolina and had not been caught at press time this week.

Building in Future Restricted on Queen Street by Ordinance

An ordinance passed Monday night by the Kinston City Council will prohibit future building along Queen Street nearer than 50 feet to the center line of the street.

This ordinance was drawn in compliance with a request from the Highway Commission which sought to protect this heavily travelled artery from further encroachments. It was pointed out in passing the ordinance that practically all of the property now along the street complies with the ruling and the law was being passed merely to keep it that way.
