CT&T Offers Stock To Its Employees

An Employees' Stock Plan, the first of its kind for Carolina Telephone and Telegraph Company, was put into effect on September 7.

The plan will enable employees of the company with more than three months' service to purchase the company's stock on a payroll deduction installment arrangement at the rate of \$5 per month per share. Employees of the company will be allowed to purchase one share of stock under the offering for each full \$500 of annual earnings. The stock will be sold to employees at 65% of the average bid and asked price of the stock on the last day of the month on which payments are completed. However, the price will not be more than \$150 or less than \$100 per share.

Stockholders of the telephone company held a special meeting on August 16 to amend the charter of the company to enable the Employees' Stock Plan to be carried. The amendment to the company's charter stipulated that a total not

to exceed 25,000 shares of common stock may be issued to employees. Directors of the company authorized the offering of 12,000 of the shares to eligible employees. The remaining 1,000 shares may be authorized by the Board at a later date.

J. F. Havens, Vice President in charge of personnel and public relations, stated that the company management felt that much would be gained by having employees become stockholders in the firm. The company now employs some 2,200 people and Havens stated that preliminary surveys indicated the

majority of the employees would participate in the stock purchase plan.
