ged out and the boys began seeking the answer to Hodges' next political step. Senator Kerr Scott whose senatorial term expires in 1960 just as Hodges ends his job as governor was thought to be the most likely target of the ambitions of Leaksville's gift to Tar Heel politics.

But another exhilarating experience intervened in the summer of 1956 at the National Democratic Convention. There, Hodges quickly grasped the significance of what has to be done to move from the state to the national political arena. He saw great men of the caliber of Senator Richard Russell shunted to one side by hungry power seekers of the Kefauver variety. This paradox was made possible or forced by one man, Russell, standing with his native Georgia on the question of state rights and federal interference into purely state affairs, while Kefauver with the flexible morality of the power-seeker "raised himself above sectional matters" and swallowed lock, stock and barrel the political pimping of the National Democratic Party and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

This lesson was not lost on Luther. Now that he had all he wanted from the people of North Carolina he abdicated his former strong attitude against the federal court interference in our schools and began referring, prayerfully to "voluntary segregation" and this month reached the pinnacle of his abdication by sounding off in full Harriman or Kefauver fashion, "We will not tolerate violence in North Carolina". To which the people rightfully are asking, "who provoked the violence, North Carolinians, outside meddlers or internal self-seekers?"

Kefauver is not totally eliminated from national political prominence; no man of such consuming ambition and over-powering ego ever is until he goes to his "just reward". But he has twice struck out on the national level, and politicians like the fresh scent of success when they start looking for some "Christian" to toss in the national arena. Hodges has that odor, if no other. In business and in politics he is batting 1000, which is better than par for the course.

Hodges is rational enough to accept the unlikelihood of ever grabbing the presidential nomination since geographically if in no other way he is a Southerner. But a fate so kind as that of Hodges might even promote his address to 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, which is the White House in case you are not too familiar with District of Columbia house numbers.

To the 1960 national convention Hodges can come with the first southern state to "voluntarily mix negroes and whites in its public schools", this would make him acceptable if not palatable to the Walter Reuthers and Carmine Di Sapios who rule the Democratic Partyroost at present. His business connections would be sufficient to grab him the necessary "conservative" support, his eternal "Rotary Club" handshaking would do the rest.

If you think this is so far-fetched you don't know "Luther Like We Know Luther".
