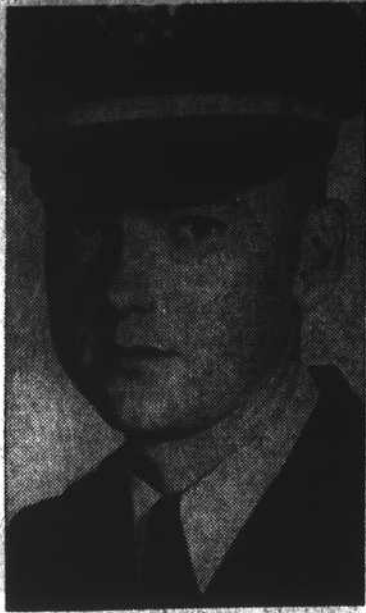


### Trentonian Ends Basic Training Course For Infantry Officers

But the bill as reported from committee does include positive provisions for the protection of the rank and file worker and for the encouragement of honest unionism. criminal penalties for failure to report and false entry. It provides criminal penalties for the destruction of union records. It makes embezzlement of union funds a Federal offense. It forbids anyone convicted of a serious crime from holding union office until his voting rights have been restored by the State. The bill guarantees the right of secret ballot to union members in the election of their officers and requires that the elections be held within a stipulated time. Limits are placed upon the establishment and the duration of

### N. C. State College To Host 'Institute'

North Carolina State College will be the scene of the first Agricultural Cooperative Institute to be held in the state next month.

Robert S. Boal, marketing specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service, has announced that the first such Institute will be held July 9 through July 11. Meetings will be in the College Union Building.
