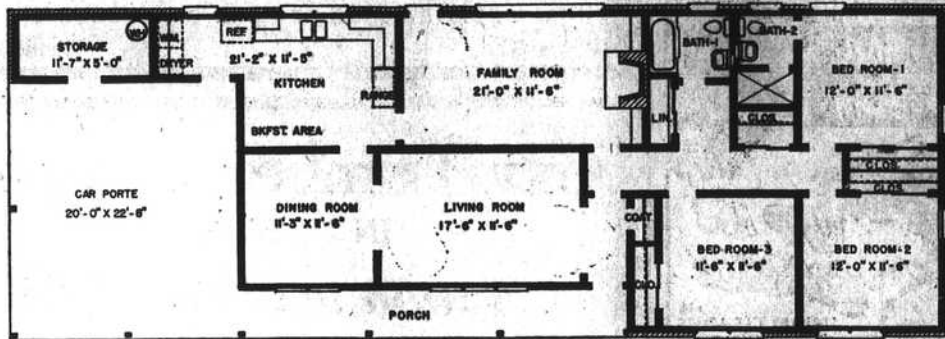

COLD WEATHER TIME FOR CARBOHYDRATES — Is cold weather hard to take? Research shows that carbohydrate foods are cold weather protectors. Best known are: Fruits, most vegetables, breads, cereals, milk. Be sure bread and cereal are enriched or whole grain.

SOMETHING DIFFERENT IN MENU PLANNING — For a change of menu, switch the high protein food of the meal from the main course to the dessert course. Add preserved ginger, chocolate chips, or plump raisins to baked custard. Tasty bread puddings are good selections, too. Angel food cake or meringues, teamed with fruit or ice cream are bargains in high quality protein as are cheese cakes and baked Alaskas.

TEEN-AGERS NEED GOOD BREAKFAST — It's foolhardy for high school students to trade their breakfast for a little extra morning sleep. It is practically impossible to make up the food missed at breakfast by eating snacks or "overeating" at other meals. Breakfast should provide at least one-fourth of the teenager's total daily food intake. That mid-morning hunger, feeling among teen-agers can be stopped with a good serving of eggs at breakfast. Because high protein foods are slowly digested, hunger comes less quickly after eating eggs for breakfast.

Fudge Is Fun With Chocolate Chips



HERE'S ONE SURE WAY TO KEEP THE YOUNG 'UNS BUSY and happy on those dark days when they must stay indoors. Let them make fudge this quick and easy way. Melting the chocolate chips is the only cooking needed. And the child will take pride and pleasure in making something the whole family can enjoy.

QUICK CHOCOLATE FUDGE

- 1 cup chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Melt chocolate over hot water. Add condensed milk; stir until blended. Remove from heat; add vanilla. Spread on greased 8 x 4-inch pan or on a plate, or drop from teaspoon on waxed paper. Decorate with nuts if desired. Chill in refrigerator, or let stand at room temperature several hours, until firm. Makes 21 squares or about 3 dozen small drops.

FARM QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION: Should I use MH-30 for tobacco sucker control?

ANSWER: It is advisable not to use the chemical until scientists are able to determine under what conditions, if any, it can be used without affecting tobacco quality. Research has already shown that MH-30 causes some chemical and physical changes in tobacco. Some of these changes are desirable and some undesirable. Rather than take a chance on lowering the quality of their tobacco, farmers should refrain from using MH-30 until further research on its effects is completed.

QUESTION: Is tobacco usage in the United States expected to increase or decrease in 1959?

ANSWER: Domestic use of both flue-cured and burley tobacco is expected to continue upward in 1959 because they know it has all been worthwhile.

1959 as a result of increasing cigarette manufacture. Present indications point, however, to a decrease in flue-cured tobacco exports this year.

QUESTION: How did pig farrowings in the fall of 1958 compare with farrowing a year earlier?

ANSWER: Farrowings were up 13 per cent. This is expected to cause hog prices to be weaker in the spring of 1959. Hog prices are expected to reach an early seasonal peak in July and trend downward in the fall. A large build-up of hog numbers is expected to come in the 1959 spring pig crop. This will greatly depress fall prices. While hog prices will fall below those of a year ago, the early corn-hog ratio is expected to be favorable.
