Fatality No. 17

Private T. J. Duke of Camp Lejeune died in a Kinston hospital last Friday afternoon from injuries he suffered at about midnight Thursday night in a wreck south of Kinston. A car owned by Sgt. Arthur Ortiz and reportedly driven by Private Rito R. Guerra went out of control in a curve on US 258 just north of Jonestown and after skidding and rolling for several hundred feet wound up in front of Roy Taylor's store. Duke suffered a skull fractured that led to his death. Ortiz had minor head injuries and Guerra escaped with cuts and bruises. The driver will be indicted for manslaughter.
