## The Veterans Corner

Q — Following World War 11, I filed a claim for disability resulting from a back injury incurred in service. The claim was not allowed because no record could be found to show that I had been treated in the service for a back injury. Now after 16 years a record of my service hospitalization for the back injury has been found. Will my claim be paid retroactively back to the date I filed it?

A — It may be paid retroactively if the claim is allowed. The service connection would be established by the record of your treatment in the service. Your disability will have to be adjudged at least 10 per cent in order to be compensable. And it will have to be shown to exist still and to have existed during the past

16 years. If you have been hospitalized or treated by a physician for your back injury during this period, such evidence will support your claim that the disability has been continuous.

Q — Since I bought a home with a GI loan, my family has increased. I have used my GI loan rights, but is there any way I can get a supplemental GI loan for remodeling my home to provide additional living quarters?

A — You may get the loan guaranteed by the VA, if the holder of your present mortgage is willing to make the supplemental loan. Eligible veterans may get VA guaranteed supplemental loans for alterations, repairs or improvements needed to maintain their property or to substantially improve the livability of their home.

Q — I understand it is necessary to direct GI insurance to the proper insurance office. How many VA insurance offices still exist?

A — There are three insurance offices: The Federal Center in Denver, Colorado; the VA Center in St. Paul, Minnesota; and the VA District Office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
