

## Chicken For Hearty Appetites On Father's Day



Chicken Imperial, the 1959 grand national prize-winning chicken recipe in the National Chicken Cooking Contest, was named by the Father's Day Council as the official dish for Father's Day, June 17. Selection of the official chicken recipe was made by the Home Economists of the Poultry and Egg National Board, Chicago.

Tender, young broiler-fryers are used for this appetizing dish. Cut into halves, the chickens are oven-baked until crisp and golden in a tantalizing sauce, gently spiced with curry, oregano, mustard, garlic and paprika.

Should the weather permit your moving outdoors for your Father's Day dinner, you'll find that "Chicken Imperial" makes a fine picnic fare. Serve the chicken piping hot, accompanied with shoestring potatoes and a large salad of crisp greens with tomato wedges. Lemon-meringue pie with mugs of steaming hot coffee provides a fine finish to Father's Day dinner served indoors or out.

### Chicken Imperial Father's Day Style

| 2 broiler-fryers, 2 1/2 to 3 lb. each, halved | 1 to 2 teaspoons curry powder     |
| 1 teaspoon salt                               | 1 teaspoon oregano                |
| 3/4 cup butter or margarine, melted           | 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard          |
| 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce              | 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder        |
|   | 1/2 teaspoon paprika              |
|   | 2 or 3 dashes Tabasco sauce       |
|   | 3/4 cup chicken bouillon or broth |

Season chicken halves with the salt. Place in shallow baking pan skin side down. Prepare basting sauce by blending the remaining ingredients. Brush chicken with this sauce. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) turning and basting chicken with pan drippings several times. Bake until tender, 1 to 1 1/2 hours. Increase oven temperature last 15 minutes to crisp chicken. Remove from pan. Pour pan drippings over chicken or serve separately. Makes 4 servings, half-chicken per person.

From the question box:

I have a good location for a hardy hydrangea. Can I set a plant this time of year? Yes, if you can find one which has been grown in a container (nursery container grown stock.) Try your local nurseryman or garden center.

From a lady in Eastern Carolina: "I have read somewhere that Captan can be used for the control of bunch grape diseases. Is this true? If so, can you help me?"

Captan, with Malathion and Methoxychlor, may be used effectively for the control of both insects and diseases which attack the bunch grape.

Materials should be mixed as follows: Captan (50 per cent wettable powder), three tablespoons; Methoxychlor (50 per cent wettable

power), three tablespoons; Malathion (25 per cent wettable powder), four tablespoons; water, one gallon.

For 10 gallons of spray, use three ounces Captan, three ounces Methoxychlor and five ounces Malathion.

For bunch grapes, spray every two weeks until two weeks before the grapes ripen. Spray thoroughly.

It is usually not necessary to spray Muscadine grapes. However, if you wish to protect your plants from insects and diseases, the same materials and schedule may be used as given for bunch grapes.

The same spray formulation is also effective for the control of insects and diseases which attack apples, peaches, raspberries and dewberries, blue berries and strawberries.

In the mountains: For strawberries, spray at two-week intervals until berries start to form. At this stage, drop out Methoxychlor and Malathion and spray with Captan alone, eight tablespoons per gallon of water, until harvest time. After harvest, continue at two-week intervals using full schedule.

In the mountains: For blueberries, spray at two-week intervals until late August.

Always be careful when using pesticides, whether spray or dusts. Read the instructions on the containers and follow directions for proper use.
