## Teen-Dems Officers Have Planning Meet, John Hughes Presides

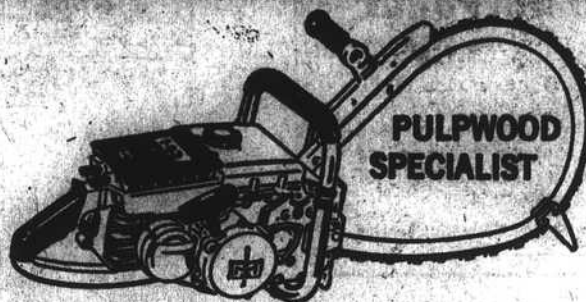
The State Officers of the Teen-Dems of North Carolina held a planning session last Saturday at Party Headquarters in Raleigh.
