ing developed by The Atlanta Con-stitution. It involves Martin Luther King and his so-called Southern Christian Leadership Conference and a man named Jack O'Dell.

It is important to remember that The Atlanta Constitution is by no means a conservative or segrega tionist newspaper. Its editor is Ralph McGill, regarded as extremely liberal and a longtime advocate of forced integration of the races.

Just the same, it is The Constitution that is pushing an inquiry into this man, Jack O'Dell. O'Dell is not only a Communist, clearly identified. He has been an organizer for the Communist Party. He also is, or has been, an important official of Martin Luther King's organization which has been promoting racial unrest throughout the nation.

When this bit of information was first published, Dr. King began to cry "smear" and "McCarthyism." He rejected an invitation to discuss the matter with Georgia's Attorney General Eugene Cook, despite the fact that Cook assured King that the invitation did not imply a full-scale investigation. King, meanwhile, told a news conference that the Communist, O'Dell, "no longer" worked for the Negro organization, that O'Dell left the organization on June 26 because as King put it, "it was feared that (O'Dell's) presence would be used against the integration movement by segregationists and race baiters."

Well, maybe so. But that does not answer the question of why a Communist was in the echelon of King's' organization in the first place. And it is significant that King offered not the slightest indication that he was embarrassed or concerned about his relationship with such an individual.

But there is one further aspect which, it seems to us, demands explanation by King. One day last week, United Press International telephoned the New York office of King's organization and was told that Jack O'Dell is the administrator of the New York organization. Not "was." Is!

We do not accuse Dr. King of deliberate falsehood. Nor do we accuse the integrationist movement of being either Communistic or Communist - inspired. But the miserable position in which Martin Luther King now finds himself emphasizes a warning which all Ne- the Court for relief sought. groes should heed.

The warning was spoken eloquently on January 16, 1958, when FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover appeared before a committee of Congress. In response to a question Mr. Hoover said:

"The Negro situation is being exploited fully and continuously by Communists on a national scale. Current programs include intensified attempts to infiltrate Negro mass organizations. The Communist Party's objectives are not to aid the Negroes - but are designed to take advantage of all controversial issues on the race question so as to create unrest, dissension

ve say, in January 1958, All Americans, including Dr. Martin Luther King, should ponder the fullfillment of the FBI Director's warning. Precisely what he forecast has come to pass.

And there is still another citizen who should ponder the situation - Attorney General Robert Kennedy! Mr. Kennedy told Congress the other day that he had been "unable to find" any Communists in the civil rights movement. Perhaps Mr. Kennedy should consult with Mr. Hoover. In the meantime, it is to be hoped that Senator Ervin will direct a few pertinent questions to Attorney General Kennedy in this connection.

For, after all, the Justice Department which Mr. Kennedy heads is required by law to investigate Communist infiltration in the United States: The files of the House UnAmerican Activities Committee and the Senate Internal Security Committee are brimming with names that ought to be of interest and concern to the people of this country while evaluating the so-called civil rights movement.

The racial unrest that is running rampant throughout the country is now far beyond a political issue. If it is now a spawning ground for Communism, the nation needs to know it. And if it isn't, Martin Luther King and other ledaers in the agitation deserve to be cleared of suspicion.

They have not, as yet, done very much to clear themselves.

That provision lies at the very heart of representative government. It is the essence of modern democracy, for it provides the means by which the people of this country can control their own political destiny. Yet today we are witnessing the the decline of the legislative branch of our Government. We see the Congress more and more yielding to the executive and judicial branches, abdicating legislative authority in the face of power grabs from both other branches.

Members of the Federal judiciary, appointed for life and immune from public reaction, constantly extend their power over the people by nullifying legislative enactments and substituting their own concept of what the law should be. It is easy to understand his greed for personal power, recalling Lord the jail cell he was placed in.

What is harder to understand is why the Congressmen of these United States, supposedly repres-entative of their individual constituencies and their States, should bend their knees to Presidential uusurpation of authority.

Never has the United States stood more in need of congressional courage, Seldom has representative government faced a greater trial in America. And at no time has the Constitution of the United States been in greater danger of internal collapse.

Congress has the right, the responsibility, the duty and the opportunity to save itself, the Constitution and the country. But does Congress have the guts?
