Funeral services were held Wednesday for Willett H. Hawkins, 66, of Trenton route 2, who died Monday after a lingering illness.

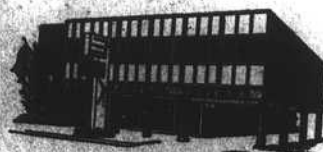
