

Farm Exports Add About \$50 To Pocket of Each Tar Heel

North Carolina's 1962 agricultural exports amounted to nearly \$50 for every man, woman and child in the State.

This figure is based on a recent report by the Economic Research Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

The report said North Carolina's "proportionate share" of United Agricultural exports in 1962 was about \$217.7 million.

Tobacco, of course, accounted for the lion's share of N. C. farm exports: \$170 million or 78 per cent of the total N. C. farm exports. Cotton exports amounted to \$22.2 million, or about 10 per cent of the total.

In other words, tobacco and cotton accounted for about 88 per cent of the farm exports moving from the Tar Heel state.

North Carolina's share of other U. S. farm exports was relatively small. They included corn, \$4.8 million; wheat, \$7.2 million; soybeans, \$5 million; poultry, \$4.7 million; peanuts, \$1.4 million and fruits and vegetables, \$2 million. Livestock sales abroad amounted to another \$35,000
