Funeral services were held Monday for Henry Tull Hines, 46, native of Kinston, who died in New York City last Friday.

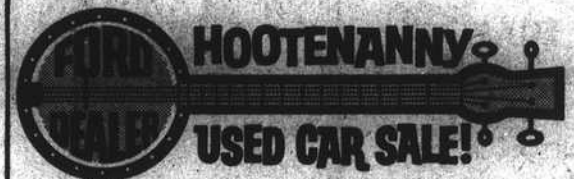
