

Cheese Puffs

Cheese Puffs have an unusual method of preparation in that they require only one rising period and the recipe calls for enriched self-rising flour. Self-rising flour with the added baking powder leavening in it, will produce the lightest, tenderest yeast rolls and breads ever. And with the extra nutrients (B-vitamins, iron and calcium) provided in the enrichment process, you'll be serving tiny rolls with top nutrition value. Try 'em with spaghetti suppers, too.

CHEESE PUFFS

| 1 package yeast, compressed or dry | 1 1/2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour* |
| 1/2 cup water (lukewarm for compressed, warm for dry) | 1 tablespoon sugar |
| 1/4 cup shortening | 1/2 teaspoons dry mustard |
| 2 eggs | 1 tablespoon milk |
| 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese (4 ounces) | Shredded cheese for topping |

Soften yeast in water. Cream shortening. Beat in eggs one at a time. Blend in cheese and softened yeast. Sift together flour, sugar and dry mustard. Blend into cheese mixture and beat until smooth and elastic, 2 minutes on medium speed of electric mixer or 300 strokes by hand. Fill paper or greased medium muffin cups 1/3 full. Let rise in warm place (85° F.) until doubled, about 1 hour. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 15 to 18 minutes or until golden brown. If desired, brush tops of rolls with milk and dip into shredded cheese for topping.

Makes 12 cheese puffs.
*If you don't sift and in the absence of other directions, spoon flour directly from container into a 1 cup dry measure, level off and remove two level tablespoonfuls according to USDA recommendations.
