



Some timely reminders. This is the time to keep plants growing in the vegetable and flower gardens. Frequent shallow cultivation of the soil around plants which are not mulched will help. Watering all plants as needed is a must if you want tender, tasty vegetables.

Insects do not take vacations because they are too busy filling up on tender growth and completing their life cycles. Sevin is good, and safe, for use on both chewing and sucking insects, except red spiders, on vegetables, flowers, and ornamental plants. For the red spider, use malathion.

For fungus, diseases, leaf spots, mildew, etc., use captan, ferbam, or one of the copper compounds. A "one shot" dust or spray for roses is usually satisfactory if regular applications are made. In the cases of dusts, keep the foliage covered at all times, especially after rains.

Keep the staked tomatoes pruned by pinching out the young shoots as they appear in the axils of the leaves. Mulch them heavily and protect them at all times with sprays or dusts.

Bulbs, such as jonquils, should be lifted, divided and replanted as soon as the leaves have turned brown. It is usually only necessary to do this once every three years. However, some gardeners lift, divide and store in a cool dry place for planting in the fall.

Right now (June) caladiums are in good supply in our area. I saw some nice plants a few days ago in wood bands. The bands can be removed very easily and the plants set in the soil without disturbing the root system. If you need some color around the foundation of a new home or in a plant box, this is the one. Petunias are good, too.

Cuttings of many kinds root readily now and will make strong plants before cold weather sets in. It is best to make a frame and put about six inches of a rooting medium consisting of equal parts, by volume, of coarse sand and peat moss. Provide shade, protection from wind and keep watered but

not too wet. When cold weather comes the frame can be covered with plastic.

?—Is it safe to use harsh cleaners on refrigerators and other kitchen appliances?

Don't use harsh cleaners to scrub off messy smears and finger marks. These areas may be washed with a mild detergent, rinsed and dried well with a clean cloth. A special wax made for kitchen appliances does an efficient job, leaving an invisible wax coating to

Poor Crop Growth Can Be Corrected

protect the surface and resist dirt.
?—Can you suggest an easy way to get asparagus from a can without breaking the spears?

Try opening the can of whole asparagus spears from the bottom. This will help prevent the tips from breaking as you ease the spears out of the can.

?—Why are tomatoes cut in vertical slices for salads?

This helps keep more juice in the tomato. By the way, add the tomato at the last minute so that they won't thin the salad dressing too much.

?—Is there an easy way to squeeze lemon juice?

Moisten a small piece of cheese cloth in water and wrap it around end of lemon. The juice will be strained as you squeeze the lemon. Soak the lemon in water for a while before squeezing, roll the fruit in hands or on a surface to get the most juice from the lemon.

?—Why is some grated lemon rind bitter?

You probably grated too deep. The colored part of the rind gives you the flavor you want but the white part beneath causes food to taste slightly bitter.

Areas of poor crop growth in fields show up most during the latter part of May and most of June states Jones County Farm Agent J. R. Franck.

Quite often, these small areas of poor growth occur where the topsoil has been eroded exposing the subsoil. Frequently the subsoil is low in lime and fertility.

There are other factors that can cause poor growth such as inadequate drainage, poor physical conditions of the soil, droughty areas, insects and disease.

Regardless of the cause of poor growth areas, determining the trouble is largely a process of elimination according to Franck. That is, each possible cause is checked to see if it is causing poor growth. Those possibilities that are easiest to check should be investigated first.

If a plant nutrient disorder is suspected, it will be necessary to have the soil tested states Franck. One soil sample must be taken from the problem area and another separate sample from an adjacent area where growth appears normal.

Areas of poor growth in fields reduce profits. Very often the cause of poor growth can be determined and may be easy to correct.
