Garden Time

Some timely reminders. Get the sweet potato storage house ready for curing and storage. Used baskets and crates should be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected as should also the storage house.

Contact your County Extension office and request (Revised) Extension Circular No. 353, "Grow Quality Sweet Potatoes."

Do not remove the tops from your asparagus bed until they have been killed by frost. The longer the tops remain green, the more food will be stored in the crowns for next year's crop.

If you are growing gourds for house decoration this winter, remove them from the vines as they mature and before the plants are killed by frost.

In the vegetable garden remove the old plants of such crops as beans, peppers, and tomatoes as they finish bearing. It is a good idea to burn them as one means of reducing the disease problem.

If you have late tomato plants which are likely to be caught by frost, try this. Pull the plants up by the roots. Enclose the roots in a cellophane bag and fill the bag with moist peat moss or old sawdust.

All Farmers Urged Cooperate In Insect Control Practices

Research workers continue to find good reasons why farmers should try to cut their old tobacco

stalks and plow out the stubbles immediately after harvest. Cleaning up the tobacco field will not only cut losses from nematodes, mosaic and brown spot but will greatly reduce the insect population for next year.

Entomologists call good cultural practices in the late summer one of the most effective and economical methods of reducing hornworms, budworms, and flea beetles. By getting rid of old tobacco stalks and roots immediately after harvest, the farmer deprives insects of their food supply and breeding place.

Both hornworms and budworms winter in the top two inches of soil as pupae. This means that turning up the stubbles as recommended will greatly reduce the number of moths that will emerge the following spring.

Some research data also indicates that the pupae are usually buried in the row rather than in the middle. Turning up the roots, therefore, would get most of them. Researchers at North Carolina State have found that most of the budworms which make it through the winter are produced after September.

Research workers also report that over 90 per cent of the overwintering hornworms are produced after August 1.

This means that the earlier the old tobacco stalks can be destroyed the better. The farmer who cuts his stalks immediately is likely to spend less money for insecticides and have less crop damage in 1965.
