

Adult English Classes to Start Soon In Lenoir Technical Institute; Persons Wishing to Enter Given Details Here

Any adults who are interested in a program of high school English are requested to meet at the Lenoir County Technical Institute on Monday night, September 28, to determine at what grade level of English they will have to begin. Classes will be set up after the tests have been scored.

Credit received for any courses taken and successfully completed may be applied toward an Adult High School diploma which will be issued by the Lenoir County Board of Education. The courses may also serve as a refresher for anyone who would

like to take the High School Equivalency exam.

These courses will be offered at no cost to the students except for necessary textbooks.

At later dates, similar programs will bring in math, social studies, science, etc.

Any person planning to enroll in this program, who has not already done so, should have a copy of their school record sent to the Lenoir County Technical Institute. This may be done by contacting the principal of the last school attended and ask them to send the transcript to the Lenoir County Technical Institute.

Hints For Easier Floor Cleaning

For easier floor care, you will want to make the complete wax job last as long as possible. The wax coat protects the floor beneath it so choose cleaning methods with this in mind.

Mrs. Edith McGlamery, house and house furnishing specialist for the Agricultural Extension Service at N. C. State, says that sweeping floors scatters dust and dirt into the air although some heavy pieces of lint are picked up.

Sweeping often scratches the wax. So Mrs. McGlamery suggests that the vacuum cleaner is most efficient for sweeping, since it removes the dirt completely.

"Dry mopping is effective with any type of wax and removes dust as well as doing some polishing," adds Mrs. McGlamery. "Never use a mop that has been treated with oil as oil softens wax. The oil gives the floor a dull appearance and leaves a film that traps the dust. It may make the floor slick and hazardous to walk on."

Damp sweeping may be used on water base waxed floors. This is done by placing a damp cloth under a long-handled brush and pushing it over the floor in one direction. You may also damp sweep with a slightly moistened sponge mop. By this process, you can remove the fine dirt and dust that cannot be swept up dry. Never damp sweep a solvent base wax.

"Floors on which water-base wax has been used may be washed. Make a light suds with a mild soap or detergent or with a commercial floor cleaner. Use lukewarm water and wash the floor surface with a mop, rubbing only as hard as needed to remove the dirt. Use as little water as possible. Rinse with clear, cool water and wipe the surface dry. Use two pails and wash only a small area at a time so water will not be left standing on the surface."

Mrs. McGlamery cautions that linoleum and floor coverings are quickly ruined by harsh detergents, too much water, and too hard scrubbing. The pitting which results makes the floor care problem more difficult.

Floors on which paste wax or solvent base liquid wax have been used may be cleaned with solvent base wax cleaner or a wax floor cleaner.

Wiping up spills as soon as they occur will postpone the harder cleaning jobs. A spill on the floor is hazardous. For safety's sake, wipe it up immediately.

Heel marks on floors which will take a solvent base wax may be removed with a liquid wax of that type. Place a small amount of wax on a cloth and wipe the spot. No. 000 steel wool is used to remove spots

on asphalt tile, rubber tile, vinyl asbestos tile. Solvent base wax will damage the floors.
