## Child-Molester Indicted in Pitt and **Lenoir Counties Wednesday Morning**

A 27 year-old father of two from Plymouth was indicted by Greenville and Kinston officials Wednesday for molesting two children over the past weekend.

The man, Charles W. Johnson, was on probation from Columbia, S. C. for the same type for the same type crime and his probation officer was the man who turned him into authorities.

Friday night Johnson is charg-ed with picking up a 10 yearold girl near Northwest Elementary School at about 9:30 p.m. and molesting her in a nearby area. He is charged with making an attempt to do the same crime in Greenville Saturday af-

Johnson has been identified by the girls he bothered last Friday and Saturday as well as by another 13 year-old Kinston girl he attempted to molest last November.
