While area farm leaders were surveying to determine the economic practicability of a 500,-000-bushel grain elevator to serve the Kinston trade area the world's largest handlers of all type grains was acquiring land in the northern tip of Jones County for a 90,000 - bushel grain elevator.

Cargill, Inc., Monday announced its intention of building immediately at the old Caswell station site on the Atlantic and East Carolina Railroad between Kinston and Dover. This is about two miles North of Highway US 70 at Wyse Fork.

Tuesday night a check-up meeting was held at the court house in Kinston to determine the level of interest in the Jones-Lenoir-Greene county area in the larger half-million bushel elevator.

The larger facility would be funded by the Farmers Home Administration to offer yearround marketing and storage facilities that are now lacking in the general Kinston area.

Officials estimate that more than 16 million bushels of corn are shipped out of the Kinston trade area each year at harvest time.

They recognize that a halfmillion bushel facility would not make much of a dent in this export of an important economic factor in the best interests of the area's overall economy, start somewhere.'

County Agent Joe Koonce Jr. said interest shown at the Tuesday night meeting was not encouraging but that another meeting was scheduled for two weeks from Tuesday night and in this period an effort would be made to stimulate more interest.

Koonce said the Cargill announcement should have no real effect on the larger effort since Cargill has been operating in the Kinston area for many years, using tobacco warehouses for temporary storage. But Koonce admitted that the Cargill announcement might fect in lowering the interest of some farmers who have not analyzed the situation thorough-
