

Rain - Delayed Private School Now Taking Rapid Form



This was the scene on Monday as the last course of brick was being laid on the first of 12 classrooms under construction for the Arendell Parrott Academy just north of Kinston. The new private school for grades one through eight will open on September 7th in temporary classrooms at the First Pentecostal Holiness Church in Northwest Kinston. Seven weeks of rain this summer made use of temporary quarters necessary. There are still openings for enrollment of pupils in all of the school's eight grades, Headmaster Ray Wooten said Wednesday, but some of the classes are nearly filled. Contractor Fred Gardner says, with a continued break from the weather, classrooms will be completed for use by mid-October on the 55-acre site donated to the school by Mr. and Mrs. John F. Mewborne.
