Airman Harriett, who attended North Carolina State University at Raleigh, is being assigned to Hunter AFB, Ga., for duty with the Air Defense Command.

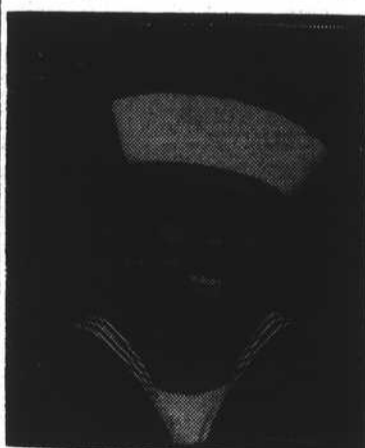
AF Commission to Kenneth E. Mize

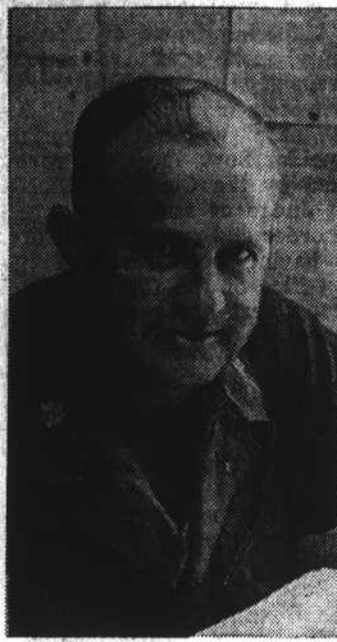
The lieutenant, a graduate of Contentnea High School, received his B.S. degree in 1965 from East Carolina College.
