? — Why do most recipes for making cocoa suggest that you beat it with a rotary beater just before serving? This puts air into the cocoa and makes it have a frothy appearance. It also insures complete mixing.

? — What is the difference in the use of canapes and hors d'oeuvres? Canapes are always served at the beginning of a dinner. Hors d'oeuvres may be used as a first course, as an accompaniment to soups, salads or cocktails or form the main part of an afternoon tea.

? — What are canapes? Canapes are usually made of toast spread with highly seasoned mixture of meat or fish. They may be served hot or cold. (Open-face sandwiches come under this heading.)

? — How do you prepare the bread for canapes? Stale bread is used. Cut in quarter-inch slices, into any shape desired. The bread is either deep fat fried and drained on absorbent paper; sauteed in a little butter as possible; or toasted.

? — How can I reduce crumpling or wrinkling when laundering permanent-press garments or items? This can be done partially by avoiding over-crowding in the washer and or dryer. Rinse water should be cold. The clothes should go through a cool-down period at the end of the drying period to cool the clothes while tumbling, thus preventing heat set wrinkles after the tumbling stops. Don't overdry.

? — Can you tell me what size freezer the average family should purchase? There are many factors to be considered, but six cubic feet of freezer space per person will meet the general needs of most families. When most of the food for the year is stored in the home freezer and there is much overlapping of storage time for the various foods, 10 cubic feet per person may not be excessive.
