Staking and pruning tomato heavy doses may even damage plants will result in higher quali- the paint. ty fruit, cleaner fruit and harvesting will be easier.

Select a suitable stake about five feet long and about one inch square. Sharpen one end and drive in the ground secure usually about six inches to one foot. Set the stake about four inches from the plant.

Make the first tie about twelve inches from the base of the plant and then tie at twelveinch intervals as the plant grows. For tying I like cloth strips torn from an old sheet or similar material. Soft, heavy cotton string may also be used. Place the strip (or string) around the stem of the plant, cross once and tie securely to the stake.

Pruning is simple and should be done to prevent excessive suckering. As the tender shoots appear in the axils of the leaves, pinch them out. This takes very little time and will improve both the appearance and performance of the plant.

To control the more common diseases, spray with Manzate D (Maneb 80 per cent) at regular intervals, following the manufacturers' instructions. For insect control, use either Sevin or Malathion according to the manufacturers' recommenda-

That "sticky stuff" is coming down again. You may find it on your car, picnic table and lawn chairs. Don't blame the trees but rather aphids (plant lice), scale insects and white flies which are sucking juices from the leaves and stems.

As these plant juices are ingested and pass through the bodies of the insects, a "honeydew" is excreted. Aside from the sticky mess which falls from the trees, the gloss on your car may be destroyed. Prolonged


