

The student council of Senn High School, Washington, D.C., recently gave over a day to demonstrating that a belief in race differences is ridiculous. To that end the students scrawled labels - Superior and Inferior - on drinking fountains and washrooms. The "superior" race, according to the rules of this macabre game, consisted of those who wore glasses. Such "superiors" were allowed to use only those facilities so labeled; the "inferiors" were allowed to use only those facilities labeled "inferior".

The program, the student council explained, was intended to provide "a greater number of students with a more practical and personal knowledge of the ridiculousness of discrimination."


