One of the provisions of the electronic devices can be used Omnibus Crime Control and Safe to control and eradicte crime. Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act permits wiretapping and the use of electronic de-vices. The provision came about in part because of the recent U. S. Supreme Court decision, Berger v. N. Y., which laid down the Court's views on eaves-dropping and the use of electron-ic devices in court prosecutions.

divided Court reversed A Berger's conviction upon the constitutional ground that the New York statute permitting the use of testimony gained under a court authorized "bugging" was too broad and violated the protections of the Fourth Amendent.

The Senate bill deals in broad fashion with the problems raised by the Berger case by establishing statutory standards in this emotionally clouded area of the law. Principally, the Senate-passed measure seeks to clarify how wiretapping and


