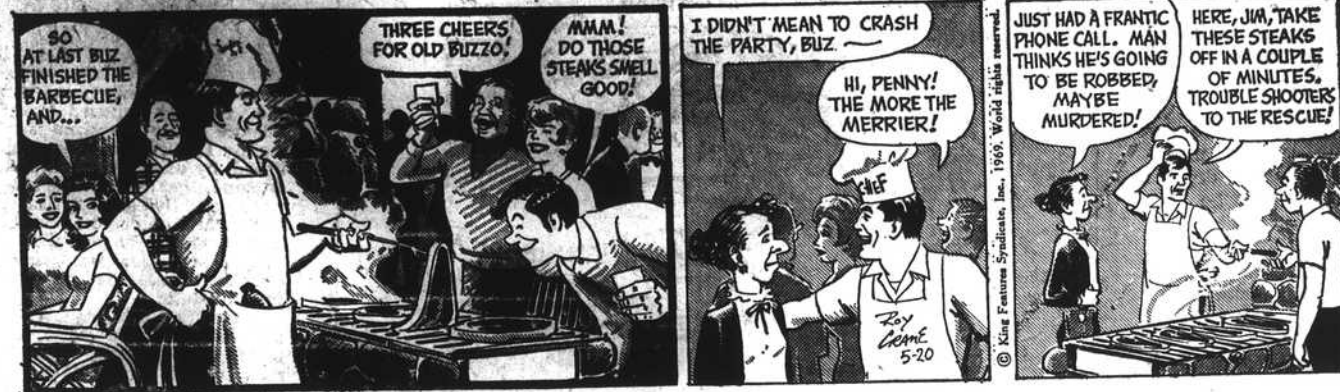

WHAT'S "COOKIE-ING"

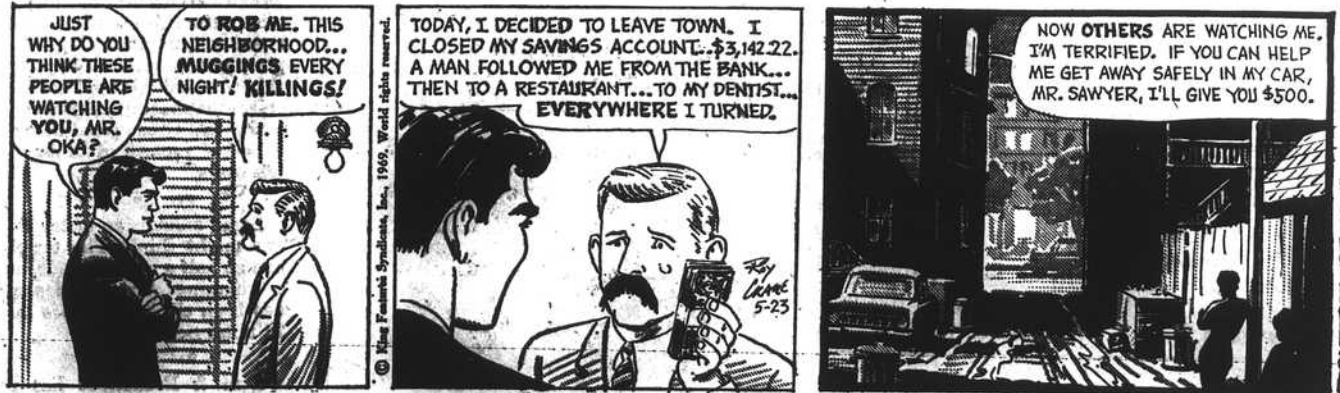
School's out and the heat's on when your youngster has just brought home his teammates for high tea. In "childrenee"—a snack!
