Q: Dr. Garrett, I know this may sound stupid, but just what is a person's IQ?

A: That is not stupid at all. There are many people who talk of IQ without actually understanding what it means. Actually, the two letters represent the words "Intelligence Quotient." tests devised by Dr. L. M. Terman sought to determine a person's potential rather than his knowledge. Technically, the tests disclose the ratio of a person's mental age to his chronological age. The IQ, then, seeks to meas-


