

Lenoir Countian Murdered in Holdup Men in Charlotte, Stepson Shot Too

Mecklenburg County authorities are seeking two young colored men who gunned down 33-year-old Linwood Daniel Suggs and his 14-year-old stepson Johnny Porch Saturday night at a Charlotte filling station.

Suggs died on the way to a hospital but Porch survived although in very critical condition from bullet wounds in the neck and arm, which have left him paralyzed over most of his body.

Charlotte officials say the two armed men told Suggs: "This is a stick up" and then fired at least five bullets into his body. Young Porch, who was inside the filling station, ran out when

he heard the shots fired and was also fired upon.

Officials of the Kayo Filling Station have posted a \$2500 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of this extremely brutal crime.

Suggs was a native of Lenoir County, a grandson of Mrs. Clemmie White in the Sand Hill Township section of Northeast Lenoir County.

The murder - robbery netted the thieves less than \$200.

National 4-H Week Set Oct. 5-11

North Carolina's 60,000 4-H members and 15,000 adult leaders will share the spotlight Oct. 5-11 with more than three million youth in 50 states and Puerto Rico. The occasion will be National 4-H Week.

The theme of the special observance is "4-H: Opportunity for All," according to Dr. T. C. Blalock, state 4-H leader at N. C. State University. "Our emphasis will be pointing out how 4-H benefits all boys and girls ages 9 to 19, of all cultural, racial and economic backgrounds and also to youth who live in town as well as in the country."

The state 4-H leader said each Tar Heel county would plan activities during National 4-H Week to:

— Encourage more youth to take advantage of 4-H opportunities.

— Urge more men and women to volunteer as 4-H leaders, and to enrich their own lives in addition to serving youth.

— Recognize the important contribution of parents to 4-H, and influence their continued cooperation.

— Acknowledge the support of 4-H friends and express appreciation to them.

— Report the year's accomplishments and consider future needs and plans.

The 4-H program is part of the national educational system of the Cooperative Extension Service. Tar Heel 4-H'ers receive training through programs conducted by N. C. State University and the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service through county agricultural and home economics agents.
